Derbyshire Food & Drink Festival

A number of Ashbourne based organisations are taking part in this event to showcase our great food & drink suppliers; venues & retailers. Marketing literature provided by the Food Festival organisers will be available in the next few weeks. We'll also issue more detailed information on the activities taking place in Ashbourne itself.

These will include beer tasting; cheese & wine tasting; special menus and events. These will run from 18th May through to 27th May.

The 2 day fair takes place on 19th & 20th May at Bolsover Castle, followed by a week of culinary events taking place at over 40 venues, including those in Ashbourne, across the County.

Projects

i) Town signage: as previously mentioned, we've consulted with residents and business to see if the current slogan "Gateway to Dovedale" is still appropriate and reflects what Ashbourne is about. It's important the message is one which residents and

local business can "own" and relate to. But it's also important it conveys a meaning to potential visitors.

We can use the slogan in many ways. For example, on "Town Welcome signs"; on visitor information leaflets; on web-sites, on promotional material etc.

Following a lot of feedback, some in support of the existing slogan, the Partnership Board have short listed six (existing slogan also included):

Georgian Ashbourne
Pride of the Peak
Town of tradition
Historic market town
Historic home of Royal Shrovetide football
Gateway to Dovedale (existing slogan)

We'd very much like your views on these. Please let us know what you think by 15 March. We will also be discussing the slogans with Ashbourne Town Council before progressing the final decision with DDDC and DCC.

It looks like we've managed to secure some sponsorship towards replacing the current "Welcome to Ashbourne" signs which are well past their "sell by date".

We are still seeking additional sponsors – if your business is interested please let us know. It will be a great opportunity to help the image of the town and to promote your organisation.

ii) Ashbourne Rewards Card : Shop Smart, Shop Local campaign.

Following a presentation at the Ashbourne Retail and Hospitality meeting, we've issued a detailed brief to town centre business. The supplier of the "chip and pin" reward cards will visit Ashbourne on Monday 12 March, Tuesday 13 March and Wednesday 14 March. They will demonstrate how the equipment works and answer relevant questions. We hope to call in on as many businesses as possible – to make sure you definitely get a visit, please let us know.

iii) Christmas 2007 – yes, we've only just finished Christmas 2006 and the Christmas planning group (representatives from ATC; Ashbourne Churches Together; Ashbourne Arts and the retail sector) have already held its first meeting. We've sent out a questionnaire to get feedback on various aspects such as Christmas trees; extra late night shopping nights; and Christmas lights switch on.

iii) Funding for Community Shops (England)

The Village Retail Services Association in partnership with Esmee Fairbairn Foundation and Co-operative and Community Finance have announced the launch of the Village Core programme which will provide £2 million of start up funding to new Community owned shops in rural areas of England. The funding which will be available over the next three years will provide up to £40,000 per shop. Eligible applicants will include community based organisations located in rural communities of not less than 200 residents.
